

## Bridging the tech gap

TechBridge, a nonprofit that provides affordable technology services to other nonprofits, held its Digital Ball May 5 at the Georgia World Congress Center, attracting 1,170 attendees and 97 corporate sponsors. More than \$1.1 million in cash and in-kind contributions was raised to subsidize the delivery of technology services by TechBridge staff to Georgia's nonprofits.

The highlight of the Digital Ball is the Technology Innovation Award, given by Accenture Ltd., which recognizes a nonprofit organization that has demonstrated effective and innovative use of technology to advance its mission, reach community targets, expand strategic goals and improve client service. The 2007 winners, the Juvenile Justice Fund and Fulton County Children's Advocacy Center, received more than \$45,000 in TechBridge services, Microsoft software and cash.
